
- "KY-41B" is referred to as "handset" in this manual.

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Using the handset

- The handset supports LTE, W-CDMA, and wireless LAN systems.
- Because the handset relies on radio signals, it cannot be used in a place with no signal (such as tunnels, underground or in buildings), in places with a weak signal or outside the LTE service area or FOMA service area. You may not use the handset in the upper floors of a building even with no obstructions in sight. There may also be times when the signal is strong and you are not moving but the call is interrupted.
- Because the handset uses radio waves, it is possible for a third party to listen in on a conversation. However, since the LTE and W-CDMA systems automatically apply a private call feature to every call, a third party that tries to listen in only hears noise.
- The handset converts conversations into a digital signal and sends it to the other party over the radio. If the signal cannot be reconverted properly by such as moving to an area with a weak signal, the voice may not be heard correctly.
- Take notes of data stored on the handset or save the data to external memory devices such as microSD cards and PCs periodically. DOCOMO shall not be liable whatsoever for any loss of content due to a failure, repair, model change or other handling of the handset.

- As with PCs, some user-accessed sites may disrupt the stability of handset performance or unexpectedly transmit information via the Internet causing improper use of your location information, personal information stored on the handset, etc. Therefore, verify the supplier and operating conditions of sites to be used before using them.
- The handset automatically performs communication for some functions, for example, to synchronize data, check the latest software version or maintain connection with the server. Also, large-volume data communication such as watching videos will lead to higher packet communication charges.
- Depending on the apps or services you are using, packet communication charges may be incurred even while using Wi-Fi.
- When the available space on the microSD card or the handset is insufficient, apps in use may not work properly. In this case, delete saved data.
- Ensure the security of your handset by setting a screen lock password in case you lose it (→P. 104).
- If terms of use appear, follow the instructions on the screen.
- Apps and their service contents are subject to change without prior notice.
- The handset does not support providers other than sp-mode, mopera U and Business mopera Internet.
- For details on usage fee, refer to the NTT DOCOMO website.

- The handset display is manufactured using highprecision technology, but it may contain dots that fail to light or that remain permanently lit on some areas. This is a characteristic of the display and not a malfunction.
- Note that DOCOMO shall not guarantee operation of commercially available optional accessories.

Precautions (ALWAYS FOLLOW THESE DIRECTIONS)

- Before use, read these "Precautions" carefully and use your handset properly.
- These precautions contain information intended to prevent bodily injury to the user and to surrounding people, as well as damage to property, and must be observed at all times.
- The following symbols indicate the different degrees of injury or damage that may occur if information provided is not observed and the handset is used improperly.

This sign denotes that "death or serious injury (*1) may directly result from improper use".
This sign denotes that "death or serious injury (*1) may result from improper use".
This sign denotes that "minor injury (* ²) or damage to property (* ³) may result from improper use".

- *1 Serious injury: This refers to loss of sight, injury, burns (high- and low-temperature), electric shock, broken bones, poisoning, etc. with remaining aftereffects, and injuries requiring hospital admission or long-term hospital visitation.
- *2 Minor injury: This refers to injuries, burns (high- and low-temperature), electric shock, etc. that do not require hospital admission or long-term hospital visitation.
- *3 Damage to property: This refers to extended damage to buildings, furniture, livestock, pets, etc.

The following symbols indicate specific directions.

D on't	Denotes things not to do (prohibition).
No disassembly	Denotes not to disassemble.
No liquids	Denotes not to use where it could get wet.
No wet hands	Denotes not to use with wet hands.



Denotes mandatory instructions (matters that must be complied with).



Denotes that the equipment should be unplugged.

Handling the handset, battery pack, adapters, and docomo nano UIM card (common)



Do not use, store or leave the equipment in locations subject to high temperatures or where heat collects (near a fire or heating unit, in a kotatsu or futon, under direct sunlight, inside a vehicle on a hot day, etc.). May cause fire, burns, injury, electric shock, etc.



Do not place the equipment inside or near cooking appliances such as microwave ovens, IH cooktops, or pressure cookers.

May cause fire, burns, injury, electric shock, etc.



Do not expose to or place directly on sand. dirt, or mud. Do not handle with dirty hands. May cause fire, burns, injury, electric shock, etc. Refer to the following for details on waterproofness/dustproofness. →P.24



Do not charge the equipment when wet with water or other liquid (beverage, sweat, seawater, pet urine, etc.). Do not charge where exposed to water

(bathroom. etc.). May cause fire, burns, injury, electric shock, etc. Refer to the following for details on waterproofness.

Do not subject the handset to strong pressure or break the handset. Especially when carrying it in your pocket, do not hit it or press it between other objects.

May cause fire, burns, or injury due to battery damage.

- Sitting or squatting with handset in your pants or skirt pocket
- Handset becoming caught in a sliding door or vehicle door when in a jacket pocket
- Stepping on the handset when it is on something soft such as a sofa, bed, or bedding, or on a floor
- Handset becoming caught in a seat on a train or bus



Do not attempt to disassemble or modify the equipment.

Use only optional accessories specified by NTT DOCOMO.

Instruction Using products other than those specified may cause fire, burns, injury, electric shock, etc.



Do not subject the equipment to strong force. impact, or vibration by dropping it, stepping on it. or throwing it.

May cause fire, burns, injury, electric shock, etc.



Do not allow conductive materials (such as metal objects or pencil lead) to come into contact with the external connector terminal. or dust to enter them.

May cause fire, burns, injury, electric shock, etc.



Do not cover or wrap the equipment with bedding etc. during use or while charging. May cause fire, burns, etc.



When caring for equipment, ensure that no disinfectant or water enters the external No liquids connector terminal, earpiece/speaker, or

mouthpiece/microphone. Handset breakage may cause injury, electric shock, etc



If charging does not complete after the specified charging time, discontinue charging, Instruction Overcharging may cause fire, burns, injury, etc.



Always power off handset or stop charging before entering anywhere flammable gas or Instruction dust may be generated.

For use at a gas station or similar location. follow the instructions of the facility.

Instruction Do not charge at a gas station or similar location.

If using at a gas station or similar location, be careful not to drop, and in particular, do not use while filling.

If there is abnormal odor/sound, smoke, overheating, discoloration, distortion, or other

do the following while exercising caution.

- Unplug the power plug from the outlet or accessory socket.
- Turn off the handset.
- Remove the battery pack from the handset.

Do not leave the equipment on unstable surfaces, such as on a wobbly table or sloped surface. In particular, be careful while handset is set to vibrate.

Do not allow water or other liquids (beverage, sweat, seawater, pet urine, etc.), metal (cutter blades, staples, etc.), flammable material, or other foreign objects to enter the docomo nano UIM card slot or microSD card slot on the handset.

Note the correct locations and orientations for inserting the docomo nano UIM card and microSD card.

May cause fire, burns, injury, electric shock, etc.



Turn off the handset or set it to Airplane mode before going aboard an airplane.

Instruction Use of handset on board an aircraft is restricted. Follow instructions of the airline.

Radio waves may adversely affect an aircraft's electronic devices.

Prohibited use aboard an aircraft may be subject to penalty by law.



For use at a hospital, follow the instructions of the institution.

Instruction Turn off the handset in areas where the use of mobile phones is prohibited.

May interfere with the operation of electronic devices and electronic medical devices.

When you are on a handsfree call, while

ringtone is playing loudly, when in standby,

Instruction etc., be sure to keep handset at a safe distance from your ears.

Adjust to an adequate volume when using earphones with microphone or similar accessory to play games or play back videos/ music.

When making a handsfree call, handset emits sound loudly.

Even in standby, the ringtone or alarm may ring suddenly.

Listening to loud sound continuously for a long time may cause hearing impairment or other difficulty.

In addition, not being able to hear surroundings may cause an accident.



Users with a heart condition should adjust vibration and ringtone volume as needed.


Instruction Handset suddenly vibrating and ringing for a new call may startle and affect persons with heart conditions.



If wearing an electric medical device or similar apparatus, check with the manufacturer or

Before using the handset in a car, check with the car manufacturer or dealer regarding any effect that radio waves may have on it.

May interfere with the operation of electronic equipment in some vehicle models. In this case, stop using the handset. Immediately stop handset use.



If use of the handset causes any skin abnormalities, immediately stop using the Instruction handset and seek medical treatment.

Handset use may cause itchiness, skin irritation, rashes, etc. depending on your physical condition. Refer to the following for details on materials of each part. →P 16



Avoid pinching your fingers or other part of vourself when opening or closing the handset. Instruction May cause injury, etc.



Handset earpiece/speaker (including at exterior case) and the area near the voice/ Instruction answering memo key use magnetic

components. Make sure that no metal objects (cutter blades, staples, etc.) are attached to the handset.

Attached objects may cause injury, etc.



View the display in a well-lit place at an adequate distance.

Instruction Viewing in a dark location or too closely may affect your eyesight.

3. Handling the battery pack



Do not touch connection terminals with anything metal or conductive (necklaces. hairpins, etc.). In addition, do not carry or store the battery pack with such objects. May cause fire, burns, injury, etc.



If you are having difficulty fitting the battery pack to the handset, do not use excessive pressure to force the battery into place. If you are having difficulty removing the battery pack from the handset, do not use excessive

pressure to force the battery out. May cause fire, burns, injury, etc. Refer to the following for details about fitting/ removing the battery pack. →P.49



Do not throw the handset into a fire or heat it. May cause fire, burns, injury, etc.



Do not apply excessive force to the handset such as by puncturing it (sharp object), hitting it (hard object), or stepping on it. May cause fire, burns, injury, etc.



Check the orientation of the battery pack before installing it in the handset.

Instruction Installing the battery pack in the wrong orientation may damage it and cause fire, burns, injury, etc. Refer to the following for details about fitting the battery pack.

If substance in the battery pack gets in your eves, mouth, etc., rinse with clean water and Instruction consult a doctor immediately.

Substance in the battery pack may cause loss of sight or other physical harm.

WARNING



If there is anything unusual such as odor. overheating, discoloration, deformation, etc., do not use the battery pack.

May cause fire, burns, injury, etc.



If the battery pack leaks or emits an unusual odor, immediately stop using it and move it Instruction away from any naked flames or fire.

Leaking fluid may ignite, causing fire, rupture, etc.



Prevent pets from biting the battery pack. A damaged battery pack may cause fire, burns,



If substance in the battery pack leaks, do not let it get on your skin (face, hands, etc.) or clothes.

May harm your eyes, skin, etc.

If substance in the handset gets in your eves. mouth, etc. or on your skin or clothes, immediately rinse with clean water.

If it gets in your eyes, mouth, etc., rinse and immediately consult a doctor.



Do not dispose of battery packs together with ordinary trash.

May cause fire, burns, injury, etc. May also adversely affect the environment. Place tape over the terminals on old battery packs to insulate them, and take them to a sales outlet such as a docomo Shop or follow municipal instructions for recycling.



Do not use or charge a wet battery pack. May cause fire, burns, injury, etc.

4. Handling adapters

WARNING



Do not use if the cord of the adapter is damaged.

May cause fire, burns, electric shock, etc.



DC adapters are only for use with minus-earth vehicles. Do not use with plus-earth vehicles. May cause fire, burns, or electric shock.



Do not touch adapters if you hear thunder. May cause electric shock, etc.



Do not short-circuit the charging terminal when connected to an outlet or accessory socket. Do not allow any part of yourself (hands, fingers, etc.) to come in contact with the charging terminal.

May cause fire, burns, electric shock, etc.



Do not place heavy objects on the cord of the adapter or apply excessive force such as by pulling.

May cause fire, burns, electric shock, etc.



When plugging/unplugging an AC adapter, keep any metal strap, etc. away.

May cause fire, burns, electric shock, etc.



Do not use a voltage converter (travel converter for overseas use, etc.) when charging with an AC adapter.

May ignite, overheat, cause electric shock, etc.



Do not apply excessive force where the adapter is connected to the handset. May cause fire, burns, injury, electric shock, etc.



Do not handle the cord or charging terminal of the adapter, the power plug, or a desktop holder with wet hands.

hands May cause fire, burns, electric shock, etc.



Always use the specified power supply and voltage.

Instruction Also, use an AC adapter for global use when charging abroad.

Using the incorrect power supply or voltage may cause fire, burns, electric shock, etc.

AC adapter: 100 V AC (household AC power outlet only)

AC adapter for global use: 100 V to 240 V AC (household AC power outlet only)

DC adapter: 12 V/24 V DC (only for use with minus-earth vehicle)



Always use a specified fuse when replacing a fuse in a DC adapter.

Instruction Using unspecified fuses may cause fire, burns, electric shock, etc. See individual instructions regarding specified fuses.



Wipe off any dust on the power plug.

Using while dusty may cause fire, burns, electric Instruction shock, etc.



Insert the power plug of the adapter in the outlet or accessory socket firmly.

Instruction Failure to do so may cause fire, burns, electric shock, etc.



When unplugging from an outlet or accessory socket, grasp the adapter body and do not pull Instruction the cord or otherwise subject it to excessive

force.

Pulling the cord of the adapter may damage it and cause fire, burns, electric shock, etc.



Insert or remove the connector of the adapter in/from the handset without bending or Instruction applying force such as pulling the cord.

Not inserting/removing it correctly may cause fire. burns, injury, or electric shock.



Cease using the adapter immediately if the charging terminal is bent or otherwise

Instruction deformed. Also, do not repair the charging terminal to use the adapter.

> Short-circuiting of the charging terminal may cause fire, burns, injury, electric shock, etc.



When not in use, unplug from the outlet or accessorv socket.

Leaving it plugged in may cause fire, burns, electric shock etc.



If splashed with water or other liquid (beverage, sweat, seawater, pet urine, etc.), immediately unplug from the outlet or accessory socket. May cause fire, burns, electric shock, etc.



Always unplug the power plug from the outlet or accessory socket before cleaning the equipment.

Cleaning while still plugged in may cause fire, burns, electric shock, etc.

Do not touch an adapter continuously when connected to an outlet or accessory socket. May cause burns, etc.

5. Handling the docomo nano UIM card

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Be careful not to scratch vourself (finger. etc.) with the edges when handling the docomo Instruction nano UIM card.

Edges may be sharp and cause injury.

6. Handling near electronic medical devices

WARNING

If you have an electronic medical device such as an implanted cardiac pacemaker or an

Instruction implanted cardioverter-defibrillator, always carry or use your handset at least 15 cm away from your implant.

> Radio waves may adversely affect operation of electronic medical devices



When using electronic medical equipment (other than implanted cardiac pacemakers/ Instruction defibrillators) outside medical facilities, check

with the equipment vendor or distributor for information about the effects of radio waves. Radio waves may adversely affect operation of

electronic medical devices.



Disable handset transmissions (e.g. airplane mode) or power off handset when it is difficult Instruction to keep a distance of at least 15 cm away

from others such as in a crowd.

Someone nearby may be wearing an electronic medical device such as an implanted cardiac pacemaker or an implanted cardioverterdefibrillator. Radio waves may adversely affect operation of electronic medical devices.



Observe a medical facility's instructions when using handset.

Handling precautions

General notes

 KY-41B is water resistant/dust resistant, however, do not allow water or other liquid (beverage, sweat, seawater, pet urine, etc.) or dust or other matter to get inside the handset or to remain on bundled or optional accessories.

The battery pack, adapter, and docomo nano UIM card are not waterproof/dustproof. Do not use in humid or steamy areas such as bathrooms and avoid exposing to rain and other forms of moisture. If they are carried on you, perspiration may cause internal components to corrode and result in malfunction. Note that if a problem is found to be due to moisture, handset and parts repair will not be covered by warranty. For repairs, contact "Troubleshooting & Repairs" on the last page (in Japanese only) or a docomo-designated repair counter.

• Clean the terminals, etc. from time to time to maintain them in clean condition.

Use in a soiled condition may prevent normal use.

Avoid damaging terminals when cleaning.

• Do not place the equipment near an air conditioning vent.

Condensation from rapid changes in temperature may cause internal corrosion and lead to a malfunction.

• Do not apply excessive force to the handset, battery pack, etc. when using them.

Placing in a bag or other storage where many other things are stuffed, or carrying in a pocket and sitting down can cause display, internal circuitry, battery pack, etc. to malfunction or break.

May also cause malfunction or damage while an external device is connected to the external connector terminal.

- Use optional accessories specified by NTT DOCOMO. Using unspecified accessories may cause malfunction or damage.
- See individual instructions included with compatible optional accessories.
- Do not drop or subject to impact. May cause malfunction or damage.

Notes about the handset

- Wipe clean with a dry, soft cloth (such as for eye glasses).
 - Wiping forcefully may scratch the display.
 - Allowing moisture or smudges to remain on the display may leave blemishes.
 - Wiping with thinner, benzine, detergent, etc. may remove print or fade colors.

- Wiping may be done using a soft cloth dampened with foam hand soap, isopropyl alcohol, ethanol, or sodium hypochlorite (→P. 28).
 - Immersing the handset or directly spraying isopropyl alcohol, ethanol, or sodium hypochlorite may cause malfunction. Always use a soft, dampened cloth.
- The handset can be wiped with a disinfectant alcohol sheet or cloth containing a small amount of alcohol (such that the cloth is dampened). The handset has been wipe-tested with the following chemicals used commonly in disinfectant alcohol sheets to test its chemical resistance.
 - (1) Isopropyl alcohol, (2) ethanol, (3) sodium hypochlorite

No noticeable discoloration or fading was confirmed in testing assuming wiping with disinfectant alcohol sheets. However, handset resistance is verified under test conditions, and complete non-occurrence of discoloration or fading is not guaranteed.

- Do not press or scratch the display forcibly. May scratch the display, causing malfunction or damage.
- Avoid using the handset in extremely high or low temperatures.

Use the handset within a temperature range of between 5° C and 35° C and a humidity between 35%% and 85%.

- Use near an electronic appliance (TV, radio, etc.) may cause interference. Distance the handset as much as possible.
- Be sure to back up the data you saved in the handset to a microSD card or PC, or make a separate note. DOCOMO is not responsible for any saved data that is lost.
- When connecting an external device to the external connector terminal, avoid inserting at an angle, and avoid pulling while connected.
 May cause malfunction or damage.

May cause mairunction or damage.

- Do not close the handset on strap, etc. May cause malfunction or damage.
- The handset may become warm while in use or charging, but is normal. Continue use/charging.
- Do not use the handset with the back cover removed. The battery pack may come out, or it may cause malfunction or damage.
- Do not cover the surface of the display or keys with an extremely thick sticker or label.

The sticker or label may catch when opening or closing the handset, and may cause malfunction, damage, or misoperation.

- While handset is accessing the microSD card, do not remove the card or power off the handset. May cause data to be erased or may cause malfunction.
- Do not place magnetic stripe cards or magnetic objects near or closed in the handset.

Information saved on cash cards, credit cards,

commuter IC cards, etc. may be erased. A strong magnetic field may also cause the handset to malfunction.

Notes about battery pack

- Always charge where at an appropriate temperature (5° C to 35° C).
- Battery life depends on the usage and deterioration of the battery pack.
- Since the battery pack is a consumable accessory, it is not under warranty.

Depending on usage, the battery pack may bulge as it approaches the end of its service life.

Replace if operating time shortens noticeably even after charging or if it bulges. For replacement, contact "Troubleshooting & Repairs" on the last page (in Japanese only) or a docomo-designated repair counter.

- To help maintain performance and life of the battery pack, do not store the battery pack in the following conditions.
 - Full (immediately after charging is complete)
 - Exhausted (too low to power on the handset) Optimal battery level for storage is 40 percent.

Notes about adapters

- Always charge where at an appropriate temperature (5° C to 35° C).
- Do not charge in these locations.
 - Where there is much humidity, dust, or vibration
 - Near an electronic device (TV, radio, etc.)
- An adapter may become warm while charging, but is normal. Continue use/charging.
- If charging using a DC adapter, do not use with the vehicle's engine turned off.

May drain the vehicle's battery.

- If using an outlet with a protector to prevent unplugging, follow the instructions for the outlet.
- Do not subject to strong impact. Do not deform the charging terminal.

May cause malfunction.

Notes about the docomo nano UIM card

- Do not apply unnecessary force when inserting/ removing the docomo nano UIM card.
- Customer is responsible for malfunction caused by use after having inserted the docomo nano UIM card in an other-brand IC card reader/writer, etc.
- Clean the IC area from time to time to maintain it in clean condition.

Use in a soiled condition may prevent normal use.

- Wipe clean with a dry, soft cloth (such as for eye glasses).
- Be sure to back up the data you saved on the docomo nano UIM card to a microSD card or PC, or make a separate note.

DOCOMO is not responsible for any saved data that is lost.

- To protect the environment, take old docomo nano UIM cards to where they are collected such as a docomo Shop.
- Do not scratch, carelessly touch, or short-circuit the IC.

May cause data to be erased or may cause malfunction.

• Do not drop or subject the docomo nano UIM card to impact.

May cause malfunction.

- Do not bend the docomo nano UIM card or place heavy objects on it. May cause malfunction.
- Do not install the docomo nano UIM card in the handset with a label or sticker on it. May cause malfunction.

Notes on using the Bluetooth function

- The handset is equipped with Bluetooth-compliant security features for communication via Bluetooth. However, these may be inadequate depending on settings. Be aware when using Bluetooth.
- DOCOMO is not responsible for any information which may be leaked during communication via Bluetooth.

Cautions on using Bluetooth devices

- 1. Before using handset, check that other radio stations are not in use nearby.
- If interference should occur with other radio stations, immediately change handset location or power off the handset to avoid interference.
- 3. If there is anything you are unsure of, contact "General Inquiries" on the last page.

Notes about wireless LAN (WLAN)

- A wireless LAN (WLAN) exchanges information using radio waves, and allows you to freely establish a LAN connection if you are within an area where radio waves reach. However, communication without appropriate security settings may allow communication to be intercepted by malicious parties. It is recommended to make security settings, and is at your discretion.
- DOCOMO is not responsible for any information which may be leaked during communication via wireless LAN.

Wireless LAN

Do not use where there are devices with magnetic fields (electrical products, AV/OA equipment, etc.) or where there is an electromagnetic field.

- Magnetic fields may increase electrical noise or may affect communication (especially when using a microwave oven).
- It may interfere with reception if near a TV, radio, etc., or the TV screen may become unviewable.
- If multiple wireless LAN access points using the same channel are in proximity, handset may not detect access points correctly.

• Cautions on using 2.4 GHz devices

WLAN devices use the same frequency band used by household appliances (microwave ovens) and industrial, scientific, and medical equipment as well as by premises radio stations (requiring a license) and specific low-power radio stations (not requiring a license) for mobile identification as used in production lines, and by amateur radio stations (requiring a license).

- Before using the handset, check that no premises radio stations for mobile identification, specific low-power radio stations, or amateur radio stations are in operation nearby.
- 2. If use of the handset causes interference with regard to an in-place radio stations for mobile identification, immediately change the usage frequency, or discontinue use, then contact "General Inquiries" on the last page and ask about ways to avoid interference (putting a partition in place, etc.).
- 3. If the handset is otherwise a cause of interference with regard to specific low-power radio stations for mobile identification or amateur radio stations and assistance is required, contact "General Inquiries" on the last page.

Water, Dust, & Shock Resistance

KY-41B is water resistant to IPX5^{*1}, IPX8^{*2} and dust resistant to IP5X^{*3} standards if the back cover is attached. The handset also has shock resistance compliant with MIL standards^{*4} (Kyocera testing methods).

- *1 IPX5: handset retains phone functioning after being subjected to a jet flow (12.5 L/min) discharged from a nozzle (inner diameter: 6.3 mm), from all directions (approximately 3 m from the handset) for 3 minutes or more.

Operation is not guaranteed for all conditions.
 Warranty does not cover malfunctions resulting from
 misuse.

What KY-41B water and dust resistance allows it to do

- You can call without using an umbrella in the rain (for rainfall of approximately 20 mm per hour).
- You can rinse off dirt from the handset. Wash the handset with low-pressure water flow (6 L/min or less tap water at room temperature (5° C and 35° C)), holding it approximately 10 cm below faucet or shower head. Wash by using only your hands, not a brush or sponge, with the back cover attached. Drain the handset before use (→P. 29).
- You can use the handset at a poolside. Do not splash pool water on the handset or submerse the handset in the pool.

Precautions before use

- Be sure the back cover is complete attached. The handset is water resistant when the back cover is secured completely.
- Never open or close the back cover while hands or the handset is wet.
- Do not immerse or expose the handset to liquids other than water (alcohol, seawater, pool water, hot spring water, soap, detergent, water with bath salts, drink, alcohol beverage, food seasoning, etc.). Also do not use where exposed to pet urine.

If exposed, immediately rinse with tap water.

- Do not place directly on a sandy beach, etc. Sand in earpiece/speaker, mouthpiece/microphone, vent, or external connector terminal may affect sound, and sand entering the handset from hinges, etc. may cause overheating or malfunction.
- Do not use under water.
- Do not use or store for a prolonged period in a bathroom, kitchen, or other humid place.
- Moisture may remain after draining. This does not affect the handset, however, do not place the handset near items you do not want to become wet. Use care, as it can cause wetting inside clothing or a bag.
- Drain any moisture that has collected in the earpiece/ speaker, mouthpiece/microphone, vent, or external connector terminal and is causing sound to be inaudible.


- The handset is not designed to be water resistant. Do not subject to direct, high water pressure or submerse under water for a long period.
- Do not wash in a washing machine, sonic washer, etc.
- Do not immerse in a bathtub. The handset is not designed to be heat resistant.
- Condensation from rapid changes in temperature may cause malfunction. Before bringing the handset into a bath room or other warm place from a cold place, let it adjust to room temperature.
- The handset does not float on water.

Back cover

- Be sure the back cover is complete attached. Anything tiny (a single hair, etc.) caught in the sealing surfaces may allow ingress of water.
- Do not wear gloves when removing or reattaching the back cover. Anything tiny (a single hair, etc.) caught in the sealing surfaces may allow ingress of water. When closing the cover, wipe away any moisture or dirt with a dry, clean cloth, even if it only appears very small.
- A deteriorating or damaged back cover will not allow the handset to be water resistant.



If liquid other than water is on handset

- If anything other than water (seawater, detergent, alcohol beverages, etc.) is on the handset, immediately rinse with water.
- Wiping may be done using a soft cloth dampened with foam hand soap, isopropyl alcohol, ethanol, or sodium hypochlorite (→P. 28).
- The handset can be washed with low-pressure water flow (6 L/min or less tap water at room temperature (5 ° C and 35° C)), holding it approximately 10 cm below the faucet or shower head.
- If soiled, hold the handset making sure the back cover cannot open, and hand-wash without using a brush.

After becoming wet with water

- After the handset has become wet with water, do not remove the back cover, and wipe away water on both the handset and the back cover with a dry, clean cloth.
- In cold regions, any moisture on the handset may freeze. Using the handset with frozen moisture may cause malfunction. Do not leave wet.

Rubber gasket

- The rubber gasket on the handset when the back cover is removed is important to handset water resistance. Do not scratch or remove.
- Be careful not to pinch the rubber gasket when closing the back cover. Forcing the back cover on with the rubber gasket pinched will scratch the gasket and may affect water resistance. Anything tiny (a single hair, etc.) caught in the sealing surfaces may allow ingress of water.
- Any liquid other than water on the gasket may affect gasket durability.
- Do not insert anything pointed in the back cover gaps. May damage or deform the handset, and may scratch the gasket and allow ingress of water.
- The rubber gasket at the back cover and handset sealing surfaces is important to handset water and dust resistance. Do not remove or scratch it. Do not allow dirt to get on the gasket. If the rubber gasket is scratched or deformed, contact a docomo-designated repair counter.

Heat resistance

• Do not immerse or splash with hot water. To not expose to hot air as in a sauna or from a dryer. The handset is not designed to be heat resistant.

Impact

 While the handset is shock resistant, shock resistance assumes usual everyday use. The handset may break if subjected to excessive shock such as being thrown or dropped forcibly.

NOTE

• To maintain water and dust resistance, it is recommended to replace parts every 2 years regardless of their condition. The handset can be submitted for parts replacement at a fee. Bring the handset to a docomo-designated repair counter.

Caring for the handset

Soiling on the handset can be wiped away with foam handsoap, alcohol, etc.

• Before caring for the handset, power off the handset and remove all wire connections.

If using foam handsoap/foam body soap

- Squeeze a little foam handsoap/foam body soap onto a soft cloth and wipe briskly
 - Be careful that no foam enters the holes in the earpiece/speaker, mouthpiece/microphone, vent, or external connector terminal.

2 Rinse away all foam completely

- Rinse the holes in the earpiece/speaker, mouthpiece/microphone, vent, or external connector terminal for about 30 seconds.
- Orain the holes in the earpiece/speaker, mouthpiece/microphone, vent, and external connector terminal adequately (→P. 29)
- Ory adequately, and check that no moisture is remaining (→P. 29)

If using alcohol

- Dab a lint-free, soft cloth with a small amount of isopropyl alcohol, ethanol, or sodium hypochlorite (such that the cloth is dampened), and wipe the handset.
- * No noticeable discoloration or fading was confirmed in testing assuming wiping with disinfectant alcohol sheets. However, handset resistance is verified under test conditions, and complete non-occurrence of discoloration or fading is not guaranteed.
- * Always carefully read instructions for using any of isopropyl alcohol, ethanol, or sodium hypochlorite sold as a disinfectant. Improper use can pose risks to health and as a flammable substance.
- * Immersing the handset or directly spraying isopropyl alcohol, ethanol, or sodium hypochlorite may cause malfunction. Always use a soft, dampened cloth.

NOTE

- Be sure to remove any store-bought accessories (straps, etc.) Check precautions given for storebought accessories.
- The handset is not designed to be water resistant. Do not subject to direct, high water pressure or submerse under water for a long period.

- When caring for the handset, check that the back cover is attached firmly.
 - * Use domestic-brand foam-type handsoap/body soap. Do not mix different types of foam handsoap/ foam body soap.

Do not use: kitchen, business, non-additive, or alkaline handsoap, business, non-additive, or alkaline body soap, soap, detergent, bath salts, shampoo, rinse, facial cleanser, makeup remover, toothpaste, etc.

If on the handset, immediately rinse with water.

When charging

- Accessories and optional parts are not waterproof/ dustproof. Check the following when and after charging.
- Never charge the handset while it is wet. May cause fire, burns, injury, electric shock, etc.
- Check that the handset is not wet. Before charging wet handset, first drain well, then wipe away moisture with a dry, clean cloth, and let dry at room temperature for at least an hour before placing in a desktop holder (KY01) (sold separately).
- Do not touch a specified AC adapter (sold separately) or desktop holder (KY01) (sold separately) with your hands wet. May cause electric shock.
- Use a specified AC adapter (sold separately) or desktop holder (KYO1) (sold separately) where not exposed to water, and do not use them near water

sources (bath room, shower, sink, basin, etc.). May cause fire, burns, electric shock, malfunction, etc. Even when not charging, do not bring in a bath room, etc. May cause fire, burns, electric shock, malfunction, etc.

• Check that no moisture or dirt remains in the external connection terminal before use.

Draining water when the handset gets wet

If the handset is wet with water, always drain the holes in the earpiece/speaker, mouthpiece/microphone, hinge, vent, and external connector terminal. Continuing to use the handset wet cause wetting inside clothing or a bag or cause sound to be inaudible.

Wipe off water on the handset with a lint-free, dry, clean cloth



2 Shake the handset

- Hold the handset firmly and shake as shown until no more water drains out
 - Before shaking the handset, check around you for hazards.
 - Hold the handset firmly so it does not fly out of your hand when draining water.



- (2) Wipe off any water draining from the handset
 - Water is particularly difficult to drain from the earpiece/speaker, mouthpiece/microphone, vent, and external connector terminal. Hold each downward and pat on cloth to wipe.

Pat the handset gently on a lint-free, dry, clean cloth and wipe away the moisture in the gaps in the earpiece/speaker, mouthpiece/microphone, hinge, vent, external connector terminal, etc.





Changing settings

When a checkbox, etc. appears for an item, you can enable/disable the setting or switch [ON]/[OFF] by pointing the cursor to the item and then pressing \blacksquare .

Incoming/charging lamp

- Incoming/charging lamp lights or flashes when a call is arriving, charging, etc.
 - Lit red: charging
 - Flashing blue: call arriving / missed calls / answering memos / new mail/SMS

 The color of the incoming/charging lamp can be changed (→P.102).

Capturing screenshots

Press and O together for at least 1 second to capture an image of the current screen.

• The captured image is saved to the handset memory and can be viewed in "Pictures" in the Data folder.



Profile

Display your own phone number registered to the docomo nano UIM card. You can register a name, mail address, etc.

- By default, only the phone number which is registered to the installed docomo nano UIM card is displayed.

- Check/use the profile



Attaching a strap

Remove the back cover before attaching a strap $(\rightarrow P. 26)$. Reattach the back cover after attaching a strap $(\rightarrow P. 26)$.

Insert the strap in the straphole

Hook the strap securely on the strap pin, and then pull strap outward

NOTE

 Check that the strap is hooked securely on the strap pin. A strap caught between the handset and the back cover will prevent the back cover from being closed completely, and will affect water and dust resistance. The strap will also become unhooked and may cause breakage or injury.

docomo nano UIM card

The docomo nano UIM card is an IC card that contains personal information, such as your phone number.


- You cannot use functions such as the phone or packet communication without inserting a docomo nano UIM card.
- In Japan, you cannot call emergency numbers (110, 119, or 118) without inserting a docomo nano UIM card.
- The handset accepts only a docomo nano UIM card. If you have a docomo mini UIM card, docomo UIM card, or FOMA card, bring it to a docomo Shop for replacement.

Installing/removing a docomo nano UIM card

 Before installing or removing a docomo nano UIM card, power off the handset, turn the handset back-side up, and remove the back cover (→P.26) and the battery pack (→P.49). Hold the handset firmly with handset closed. After installing or removing a card, reattach the back cover (→P.26) and the battery pack (→P.49).











- Refer to the docomo nano UIM card user's guide or to the NTT DOCOMO website for more information on the docomo nano UIM card.
- Do not misplace the docomo nano UIM card once it is removed.

Security code for docomo nano UIM card

A docomo nano UIM card has a security code called PIN code (\rightarrow P. 105).

microSD card

You can save data on the handset to a microSD card or import data on a microSD card to the handset.

- Commercially available microSD cards up to 2 GB and microSDHC cards up to 32 GB can be used with KY-41B (as of Apr. 2021).
- Do not power off the handset immediately after inserting the microSD card in the handset (while writing information needed for handset operation) or while editing data on the microSD card. Data may be corrupted or the handset may not work properly.
- Format unformatted microSD cards on the handset before use (→P. 117). microSD cards formatted by PCs or other devices may not be used properly on the handset.
- Data saved on microSD cards from other devices may not be displayed or played on the handset. Some data saved on the microSD card from the handset may not be displayed or played on other devices.
- Back up data saved on the microSD card or otherwise store in another place. DOCOMO shall not be liable for any loss or change of saved data.

Installing/removing a microSD card

Before installing or removing the microSD card, power off the handset, turn the handset back-side up, and remove the back cover (→P. 26) and the battery pack (→P. 49). Hold the handset firmly with handset closed. After installing or removing a card, reattach the back cover (→P.26) and the battery pack (→P.49).



The time that the handset can be used depends on the usage environment and condition of the battery pack.

Battery pack usable life

- The battery pack is consumable. Available time shortens with each repeated charge.
- Once available time is only about half of when it was purchased, it is approaching the end of its life. It is recommended to replace it soon. Depending on usage, the battery pack may bulge as it approaches the end of its life, but this is not a concern.



Charging

- Approximate charging time and usable time after fully charging →P. 146
- The battery can also be charged with the handset powered on (while charging, [5] appears on the battery icon).


- Do not charge for a long time with the handset left powered on. Leaving the handset powered on after charging is complete decreases the battery pack charge level. In this instance, an AC adapter (sold separately) or DC adapter (sold separately) charges the battery pack again. However, depending on when the handset is disconnected from the AC or DC adapter, the battery charge level may be low or the battery pack may only be usable for a short time.
- Leaving the handset unused for a long time even after charging is completed may decrease the battery level.
- If the battery pack has no charge when starting charging, the charging lamp may not light immediately. However, charging is in progress.
- If the handset displays no charge and cannot be powered on, charge the battery pack for a while.
- While charging, you may not be able to power on the handset even when the charging lamp is lit red. Charge longer and try powering on the handset again.
- Frequently recharging the battery pack when it still has charge may shorten its usable life. It is recommended to use up the battery to a certain level (e.g. after the battery level decreases) before charging.
- If the battery pack becomes warm, charging may stop even if the battery pack has not been fully charged. Charging resumes after the temperature lowers to an appropriate temperature.

AC adapter and DC adapter

- Refer to the AC Adapter 07 (sold separately) or DC Adapter 05 (sold separately) user guide.
- AC Adapter 07 accommodates from 100 to 240 V AC.
- The shape of the plug for the AC adapter is for 100 V AC (for domestic use). To use an AC adapter of 100 to 240 V AC overseas, a conversion plug adapter compatible with your country of stay is required. Do not use a voltage converter for overseas travel to charge the battery pack.







Device Control

Control function such as phone and Wi-Fi individually, and make settings suitable for work simply using Device Control. Settings can be made from the handset, and does not require a PC. Copies of settings can be made easily.

Text entry

Enter characters for functions or apps requiring text entry such as phonebook and mail on the handset.

A text entry screen

Multiple characters are assigned to each dial key. Character switches by pressing a key.



- 1) Cursor
 - Point the cursor to a position to add text.

- You can copy/paste text, make text entry settings, etc. (→P. 58).
- 3 Char.
 - Change the type of characters entered.
 - Press I to switch the character type in the order of en-width alphabet → en-width numeric → en-width katakana → hiragana/kanji.

④ Input mode

- Check the input mode. The current character type is shown with a blue icon.
- (5) Emoji, D-Pict, emoticons, symbols
 - Show emoji, D-Pict, emoticon, and symbol lists.
 - They may not be enterable depending on the app.

Kana entry and 2-touch entry

After switching the character type to kanji or katakana (em-/en-width), use either of two entry methods: "kana method" and "2-touch method" (\rightarrow P. 58).

Converting characters

Enter hiragana and press 回 for a list of conversion candidates of katakana, alphabet, numbers, symbols, as well as predicted date and time, corresponding to the dial key you pressed while entering text. This is useful for entering alphanumerics, katakana, month and day, time, etc. with the character type as "漢".

Example: Enter "かきく" and press 回, and conversion candidates such as "ABC" are displayed.

Correcting text

Back function

At times such when pressing a key too many times and going past a character you want to enter, you can press (a) to go back to the previous character.

Example: When wanting to enter "さ" but have gone to "<", press
の
to go back to "さ".

• This function is available when "Input method" is any setting other than "2-touch method".

Undo function

Prediction conversion

Set "Conv mode" (\rightarrow P. 58) to "Predictive conv" to have frequently used words as well as phrases that you have converted/finalized displayed as conversion candidates.

- Example: Simply enter "か", and prediction conversion candidates such as "彼" are displayed, and press 🖸 to select. Prediction conversion candidates that are predicted to continue after finalized text are also displayed.
- Example: Enter "私" and "は", "の", "が", etc. are displayed as prediction conversion candidates. Press ひ to select.

- You can press 📓 and switch between prediction conversion candidates and normal conversion candidates. When "Conv mode" is set to "Normal conv". press III to display normal conversion candidates.
- Press [717] before finalizing to cancel conversion.

2-touch entry

Set "Input method" (→P. 58) to "2-touch method" to enter characters using 2-digit numbers. Enter the first digit and a number appears, then enter the second digit to display the character.

- With VoLTE, you can enjoy high-quality calling.
- To use VoLTE, your handset must meet the following requirements.
 - Be in an area where VoLTE is available
 - The call mode setting in mobile network settings must be on →P. 110
 - The preferred network mode in mobile network settings must be [4G/3G(Auto)] →P. 110
- In the DOCOMO LTE service area, if the call mode setting is off, data may temporarily switch to 3G.

• Even after the call mode setting changes to on, voice communication and data communication may not immediately change from 3G to LTE (4G).

Entering touch-tone signals

When using services in which you are required to enter numbers additionally during a call, such as a bank balance inquiry or ticket reservation, enter a pause (,)/ wait (;) after entering the phone number to send an additional number added to the main phone number.

Adding a 2-second pause (,)

Once the call connects, the added number will be sent automatically after about 2 seconds.

After dialing in the main phone number, the handset automatically waits and then confirmation appears for sending an additional number.

NOTE

• The handset supports "emergency call location notification".

When you make a call to an emergency number such as 110, 119, or 118, the location dialed from (location) is automatically sent to the agency that has received the emergency call (e.g. the police). Depending on your location and the signal reception, the agency that has received the emergency call may not be able to confirm the exact location. If you are not sending your caller ID by calling with "184" added or other means, your location information and phone number are not sent. However, if the agency that has received the emergency call considers your location information and phone number necessary, such as in a life-threatening situation, the agency can retrieve your accurate location by GPS and phone number regardless of your settings. In addition, the area/timing at which that "emergency call location notification" service is introduced depends on the current preparation of each agency that receives emergency calls.

- In Japan, you cannot call to an emergency number (110, 119, or 118) when a docomo nano UIM card is not inserted, while the SIM PIN is locked, or from the PUK (PIN Unblocking Key) entry screen.





- GPS is a function to retrieve the location information of devices by receiving radio waves from GPS satellites. It is necessary to enable Location to obtain current location.
- You cannot use the handset as a navigation system for aircraft, vehicles, persons, etc. or high-accuracy surveying GPS. DOCOMO is not responsible for any (pure economic loss (damages, etc.) resulting from lost opportunities such as checking location results or communication due to malfunction, misoperation, external causes such as power stoppages (including power outages), etc. of the handset, when used for the above or any other purpose.
- GPS is a service administered by the US Department of Defense. Therefore, the condition of GPS radio waves may be controlled (accuracy degradation, radio wave stop, etc.) for US national security reasons. In addition, same results may not be obtained even when positioning is done in the same location and environment, since the condition of radio waves may change depending on the location of the GPS satellites.

- Note that GPS uses radio waves from artificial satellites, and therefore the following conditions may prevent radio waves from being received or prevent the reception of radio waves from being satisfactory, resulting in an error of 300 m or more for location information.
 - In or under a dense forest, in a high-density area with buildings or residences
 - In or under buildings
 - Inside a basement or tunnel, underground, or underwater
 - Near high-tension lines
 - Inside cars, trains, etc.
 - In bad weather with heavy rain/snow, etc.
 - Inside bags or boxes
 - When people or objects are blocking the handset
 - When hands are covering the GPS antenna area
- When using the GPS function overseas, information based on the acquired location (latitude and longitude information) may not be accurate because of the legal system, etc. in each country and the area.
- GPS assist data such as satellite information may be automatically retrieved when you obtain current location.



Early warning "Area Mail"

This service enables you to receive Earthquake Early Warnings, Tsunami Warnings, special alerts from the Meteorological Agency, and Disaster and Evacuation Information from national or local authorities, regardless of busy network conditions.

- Area Mail is a free service that does not require a subscription.
- You can save up to 50 Area Mails. If the number of Area Mails saved in handset memory exceeds the maximum number that can be saved, they are deleted starting with the oldest one.
 - Area Mail cannot be received in these situations.
 - While powered off
 - While in airplane mode
 - During a software update
 - While the entry screen for the PIN code is displayed
 - When using a non-docomo SIM card
 - During voice calls (except for voice calls with VoLTE)
- You might not be able to receive Area Mail if free memory space is insufficient, or if tethering is set or you are using packet communication.

 Area Mail you were unable to receive (Earthquake Early Warnings) cannot be received again. Other Area Mail (Tsunami Warnings, special alerts from the Meteorological Agency, and Disaster and Evacuation Information) is sent again, and can be received again if you could not receive it the first time.

- If a call, data communication, or other function is performed for a long time while charging, the handset may become warm and charging may stop. In this instance, let the handset cool down and charge it again. →P.50

Handset operation

- Becomes hot while operating/charging
 - The handset, battery pack, or the adapter may become warm during use, charging, or if using apps, etc. for a long period while charging, but this is normal. Continue use. →P.50
- Usable battery time is short
 - Is the handset outside of the service area and not used for long periods? When out of the service area, the handset searches for a signal to enable communication, and uses up more power.
 - Battery pack usable time depends on environment of usage and battery pack deterioration. →P.146
 - The battery pack is consumable. Available time shortens with each repeated charge. If usable time becomes extremely shorter than at the time of purchase even after fully charged, purchase a new specified battery pack. →P.50
- Unintended handset power off or restart occurs
 - A soiled terminal on the battery pack may cause a bad connection and the handset to power off. If soiled, clean the terminal on the battery pack with a dry cotton swab.
- No response by pressing keys
 - Make sure the handset is not powered off. ${\rightarrow}\mathsf{P.54}$
- Screen response is slow when pressing keys
 - This can happen such as when a large amount of data is saved on the handset, or when exchanging a large amount of data between the handset and a microSD card. →P.117

- docomo nano UIM card is not recognized
 - Is the docomo nano UIM card inserted facing the right direction? ${\rightarrow}\text{P.41}$
- Clock is incorrect
 - The clock time may become inaccurate if the handset is powered on for a long period. Make sure [Automatic date & time] in [Date & time] is enabled and power the handset on again in a location with good signal conditions. →P.120
- Handset operation is unstable
 - An application installed after purchasing the handset may be the cause. If the symptom improves after starting the handset in safe mode, uninstalling an app you installed can improve the symptom.
 - * Safe mode is a function whereby the handset is started in a mode close to that when purchased.
 - - * After safe mode activates, "Safe mode" appears at the lower screen left.
 - * To exit safe mode, power the handset on again.
 - Be sure to back up important data before using safe mode.

- Since the handset is not started normally while in safe mode, be sure to exit safe mode to use the handset normally.
- App does not work properly (does not activate, error frequent, etc.)
 - Are there any disabled apps? Enable a disabled app and try again. →P.118

Calling

- Calls cannot be made by pressing key
 - Is the handset in Airplane mode? ${\rightarrow}\mathsf{P.108}$
- Ringtone does not sound
 - Is the volume for ringtone / mail / notifications at [0 (Manner mode)]? →P.102
 - Is the handset in Public mode (power OFF), Manner, or Airplane mode? →P.71, P.103, P.110
 - Is a set ring start time or reject call setting set?
 →P.72, P.72
 - Is the answer time setting for voice memo set to "Osec"? →P.69
 - Is the ringing time for voicemail service or call forwarding service set to "Osec"? →P.71
- Calls cannot be made ([]] does not disappear even after moving to another place or calls cannot be made/ received even though signal status is not bad)
 - Power on the handset again or install the battery pack or docomo nano UIM card again. →P.41, P.48, P.54

- Depending on the signal type, even if "inside the service area" or "[111] (indicating signal status) appears" are displayed, making/receiving a call may not be possible. Move to another place and call again.
- Make sure a call restriction such as reject call setting is not set. →P.72
- In a crowded place, heavy telephone/mail traffic may make it difficult to get a connection depending on how congested signal conditions are. Move to another place or call again later.

Screen

- Display is dark
 - Is the screen timeout set to a short duration? \rightarrow P.101
 - Have you changed the brightness level? ${\rightarrow}\mathsf{P}.102$

Sound

- The other party's voice is not heard well or is too loud during a call
 - Have you changed the in-call volume? ${\rightarrow}\mathsf{P}.102$

Mail

- Mail is not automatically received
 - Is the auto reception setting set to [Confirm every time] or [OFF]? →P.80

Data management

- Cannot use data transfer
 - Are you using a USB hub? Using a USB hub may prevent normal use. →P.124
- Data saved to microSD card does not appear
 - Reinstall the microSD card. →P.46
- A "×" is displayed when an image is opened
 - This is displayed when the image data is damaged.

Bluetooth function

- Cannot connect to Bluetooth device/cannot find after searching
 - You must first set the Bluetooth device (commercially available) so it is waiting to be paired, and then register the device on the handset. To delete a registered device and re-register it, first deregister devices on both the Bluetooth device (commercially available) and the handset, and register them again. ->P.126
- Calls cannot be made from the handset with an external device such as a car navigation system or hands-free device connected
 - Making a call to a phone number may not be possible if you make multiple calls to the phone number when the other party does not answer or is outside the service area. In this instance, power off the handset and power it on again. →P.54

Error messages

- [Insert SIM Card / Please reconfirm.]
 - Check that the docomo nano UIM card is installed correctly. →P.41
- [Running out of storage]
 - Handset storage is full. Move or delete app data.
- [Enter PIN/Enter Password]
 - Appears when an operation was attempted while the handset lock is set. Enter the PIN or password to temporarily disable the handset lock and continue operation.
- [Cellular network not available]
 - Check that a preferred network type that is valid is set. $\rightarrow P.110$

Warranty & after-sales service

Warranty

- When purchasing the handset, a certificate of warranty is contained in the "Quick Start Guide" (in Japanese only) Read the warranty and keep it in a safe place.
 Warranty is for 1 year from date of purchase.
- Battery Pack KY01, Back Cover KY01, and Desktop Holder KY01 are not covered by the warranty.
- Note that the specifications and appearance of the handset, including accessories, may change without notice.
- Information registered in the phonebook, etc. may become altered or erased through malfunction, repair, or other handling of the handset. It is recommended that backup be kept of information such as contacts.
- * You can use the handset to save phonebook and other data to a microSD card.

After-sales service

If you have problems with your handset

Before requesting repair, see "Check here first" in this instruction manual.

If the handset still does not operate smoothly, inquire at "Troubleshooting & Repairs" (in Japanese only) on the last page.

If repair is required after inquiring

Bring the handset to a docomo-designated repair counter. The handset can be accepted during the hours of service at the repair counter. Note that repairs may require several days depending on the malfunction/ breakage.

During the warranty period

- Repair is made free of charge under the terms of the warranty.
- However, even if within the warranty period, repairs are made at charge if malfunction/damage is a result of customer mishandling (breakage of external connector terminal, display, etc.) or if the handset has been repaired other than at docomo-designated repair counter.
- Malfunction as a result of using equipment or consumables other than docomo-specified items is subject to repairs at cost even if within the warranty period.

Repair may not be possible in the following situations.

 If, after examination, the handset is determined to have corrosion from wetting, condensation, sweat, etc., or if the circuit board is damaged/deformed (it may also not be possible to repair breakage of the external connector terminal, display, etc., or cracking of the case)

- The handset has been repaired other than at a docomo-designated repair counter.
- * Even if repairs can be made, repairs are not covered by warranty and are made at charge.

If the warranty period has expired

The handset can be repaired at cost upon request.

Period that parts are stocked

Repair parts (for maintaining handset performance) are usually stocked for at least 4 years after end of production.

For details on servicing when requesting repairs, see the NTT DOCOMO website.

However, repairs might not be possible depending on the location of malfunction/breakage if repair parts are not in stock. For details, contact a docomo-designated repair counter.

IMPORTANT!

- Do not modify the handset or accessories.
 - May cause fire, injuries, or malfunction.
 - A handset that has been modified can be accepted for repairs only after receiving the customer's acknowledgment that modified components will be returned to as they were. However, the handset may be refused for repairs depending on how it has been modified.

The following instances may be deemed to be modifications.

· Stickers, etc. placed over the display or keys

- Ornamentation adhered to the handset with glue, etc.
- Replacing the exterior or other component with a non-docomo-brand item, etc.
- Malfunction or damage due to modification will be subject to repairs at cost even if within the warranty period.
- Information such as function settings may cleared (reset) through malfunction, repair, or other handling of the handset. In this instance, make settings again. Making settings may incur packet transmission fees.
- After the handset has been repaired, its MAC address for using Wi-Fi and its Bluetooth address may be changed regardless of the malfunction location.
- Note that a cash card or other magnetically sensitive item brought near the handset may become unusable.
- Although the handset is water-resistant, if water seeps into the interior of the handset or if moisture from humidity collects on the handset, immediately power it off, remove the battery pack, and visit a docomodesignated repair counter. However, repairs may not be possible depending on the condition of the handset.

Customer-created data and downloaded information

• When changing handset models or having the handset repaired, data the customer has created, loaded from an external source, or downloaded may be altered or erased. DOCOMO is not responsible whatsoever. Note that DOCOMO cannot reimburse the customer for packet communication charges resulting from redownloading data. DOCOMO may replace the handset with a substitute handset in lieu of repairs at DOCOMO's discretion. In this instance, with some data excepted, such data cannot be transferred to the substitute handset.

Software updates

A software update is functionality for updating the handset's software and allowing you to use it safely and enjoyably. This includes the following items — be sure the handset is updated with the latest software. A software update can be any of these 3 types.

• Functionality addition

Preinstalled apps and handset functions are updated to improve functionality and usability and allow smooth handset operation.

- Quality improvement Preinstalled apps and handset functions are updated to improve quality and allow smooth handset operation.
- Latest security patch update

A patch (software for patching a vulnerability) is applied to allow more worry-free handset operation. For details and time periods on software updates provided for the handset, see the NTT DOCOMO website. Updating software

Starting an update

Perform any of the following to start an update.

- From an update notification In the status bar, select the notification "Software update notified" or "Software update available" and start the update.
- From a pop-up prompting an update Once notification of an update has arrived, the pop-up "An update is available" is displayed regularly. Select [OK] in the pop-up and start the update.
- From handset settings

In the standby screen, S ▶ [Settings] ▶ [About phone] ▶ [Software update], and start the upate. If software has already been updated, "No update required. Use your device as it is." appears.

Update procedure

Perform an update as follows. Follow the handset screen for instructions.

Download and install the update file

The confirmations "Perform Now" and "Later" may appear before the update file is downloaded and installed. If a confirmation is displayed, select either of the following to proceed with the update.

(1) Select "Perform Now"

Immediately download or install the update file.

(2) Select "Later"

Specify a time to download or install the update file.

A recommended time to download or install is prespecified. To change the time to download or install, select [Change schedule] and specify a time.

To change this time later, in the standby screen,

 [Settings] ▶ [About phone] ▶ [Software update] ▶ [Change schedule], and set the time.

Prestart the handset

- Once the update is ready, the handset restarts automatically.
- Confirmation appears just before the handset restarts. To stop the handset from restarting, select "cancel" within a certain period of time.

3 Notification that the update is complete

• After the update completes successfully, "Software update completed" appears in the status bar.

Important

- After software is updated, the handset cannot be returned to the previous software.
- Information unique to the handset (model, serial number, etc.) is sent to a DOCOMO server during a software update. DOCOMO does not use this information for purposes other than software updates.
- Functions become temporarily unavailable during a software update.
- If a SIM PIN is set, a SIM PIN entry window appears after software is overwritten and the handset is restarting. Enter the SIM PIN.
- If a software update fails and the handset becomes completely inoperable, bring the handset to a docomodesignated repair counter.
- Software cannot be updated in the following instances. Try updating software again after resolving the issue.
 - During a call
 - Date/time not set correctly
 - Battery too low
 - Free space in handset storage too low
- It is recommended to update software where signal conditions are good and without moving location. A software update may be interrupted if signal is weak.

Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) Information of Mobile Phones

This model KY-41B mobile phone complies with the Japanese technical regulations and the international guidelines regarding human exposure to radio waves.

This mobile phone was designed in observance of the Japanese technical regulations regarding exposure to radio waves^(*1) and the limits of exposure recommended in the international guidelines, which are equivalent to each other. The international guidelines were set out by the International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection (ICNIRP), which is in collaboration with the World Health Organization (WHO), and the permissible limits include substantial safety margins designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health conditions.

The technical regulations and the international guidelines set out the limits of exposure to radio waves as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR, which is the value of absorbed energy in any 10 grams of human tissue over a 6-minute period. The SAR limit for mobile phones is 2.0 W/kg.

The highest SAR value for this mobile phone when tested for use near the head is $0.672W/kg^{(r2)}$, and that when worn on the body is $0.414W/kg^{(r3)}$. There may be slight differences of the SAR values in individual product, but they all satisfy the limit. The actual value of SAR of this mobile phone while operating can be well below the indicated above. This is due to automatic changes in the power level of the device to ensure it only uses the minimum power required to access the network.

This mobile phone can be used in positions other than against your head. By using accessories such as a belt clip holster that maintains a 1.5cm separation with no metal (parts) between it and the body, this mobile phone is certified the compliance with the Japanese technical regulations and the international guidelines.

The World Health Organization has stated that "a large number of studies have been performed over the last two decades to assess whether mobile phones pose a potential health risk. To date, no adverse health effects have been established as being caused by mobile phone use."


